

At study group we will work with Isaac Newton's color wheel again getting more familiar with this helpful tool. We will take an extended look the Value of a color how it affects the quality of our art quilts and how color conveys a sense of motion or stillness and the intensity of a color. Both this year's and last year's book have helpful information on this subject.

We will also play with creating an Optical illusion with value and Color. I will cut out some shapes in black and white and a few other colors and we will see if we can get our quilts to look like they move.

Supplies to bring:

1. Color wheel
2. Gray scale (I have a Pocket Color Wheel that has the Gray scale values. It cost under \$5.)
3. Glue sticks.
4. Fabric scissors.
5. Sew Red Glasses (Gray scale finder) I will share mine
4. Look through your fabric stash. Do you see a color theme? Choose 6-10 mono-chromatic fabrics to bring with you.
5. A 12 inch by 12 inch white or light green fabric square for our optical illusion.
6. Any quilt you are having trouble with or that just doesn't look right.
