

MVAQN MINUTES Nov. 16, 2019

Epiphany Lutheran Church

Treasurer's Report: Chris Z. reported that there is a \$1276.57 balance in our account. She passed around an envelope to donate to the church for letting us use the room.

Secretary's Report: October minutes are on the website. Corrections were previously made to New Business as suggested by Helen. No further corrections.

Old Business: Carroll reported on the following exhibition news:

The "Suffragist Tea" at Patterson Homestead November 17 is sold out at 70, with a waiting list. Dayton History reported that it will be the best attended tea they have ever had. They are considering having another similar tea in August without the quilts. Several of us from the guild will be at the tea, with 3 of us speaking and Peggy manning the Power Point slides. The talk will be abbreviated from our previous ones.

There will be no Suffragist show in Cleveland after the Cleveland League of Women Voters pulled out. Carroll had been corresponding with the Cleveland Library, Western Reserve and the LWV for months concerning our show, so this is a disappointment.

After the quilts come down from Patterson Homestead tentatively on December 27th, they will need to be stored until March. Joni, Fran and Chris Landis volunteered their houses.

For the show at the new U.D. Library, the space is small but we are also committed to giving 2-3 quilts to Troy-Hayner at the same time with the hopes that they can all be displayed. The UD Show is scheduled for August 18-October 4, 2020.

Fran LaSalle again reported on the Yellow Springs Sr. Center show April 17-June 30, 2020. This will be a MVAQN dedicated show. You may submit 2 pieces with a guarantee of one hanging. She will need quilts by the second week of April and can take them at the March 21st meeting. Submit your quilt name and information to her before the March meeting. She will send information on necessary paperwork and photos via email. She suggested that quilts should be less than 45 x 45" in size, with only a few quilts of that size being accepted. The Senior Center can take 3D pieces. They will do cards, publicity, and hanging. There will be a show opening April 17 with a reception (they provide wine if 3-4 of us bring snacks). The Senior Center will keep a 30% commission on any sold quilts. The group suggested "Potpourri" for a name of the show. Maxine offered to help Fran plan this show.

Carroll took final orders for covered hanging wire.

New Business:

Janet said that her church, First Baptist on Monument downtown, is looking to host a show again. The Suffrage or Mother Goose quilts are free Jan-February, April-May, or after October 5 as a possibility.

Woodbourne Library has passed on having the Mother Goose quilts, but would like to show our available Dayton Landmark quilts plus a few “recognizable Dayton” quilts from our Five Rivers Metro Park show from March 30-April 30. After a discussion it was agreed to go ahead, and Carroll will follow up with Georgia Mergler. Helen and Janet offered to help hang.

Show and Tell: Joni, Chris Z. and Deb showed ornaments made from the Study Group idea.

Chris Z. told us that the Yellow Springs Arts Council “Holiday Art Jumble” started today.

Peggy showed her unfinished quilt for the Suffragist project with a “timeline” theme.

Also showing quilts were Ann, Helen, Sara, and Chris Z.

Marilyn told us about her embroidery class.

There will be no December Study group or Saturday regular meeting. Our next time together will be January 18th for our annual Potluck. It will be at noon at Janet Lasley’s house. (in Centerville).
